## Message from the Principal

Dear families, parishioners, and friends,


It is great to be back after what we hope was a relaxing term break for all! Our staff pictured above had a most productive first day learning more about how we can deliver effective maths lessons from maths expert Michael Ymer.
Our learning aligns with MACS recently released Vision for Instruction. Its intent is that by 2030, MACs schools become the benchmark for excellence in teaching \& learning. As part of this, our conscientious staff have engaged in professional learning around cognition, how students learn best and the implications for instruction. They have continued to build on their knowledge of what learning is and in its simplest definition, Learning is a change in long term memory.
As a system and as a school we have come to know more about Cognitive Load Theory and how the brain works. One of the key aspects is knowing what the limitations of our working memory are and what impacts our ability to learn.
As a staff we aim to minimise disruptions to the classroom and therefore learning. By minimising the amount of noise and unnecessary distractions for students we allow greater time to focus on learning .PA announcements will continue to only be made at allocated times and students will only leave the classroom when necessary.

As parents you can help us by:
-Ensuring your child is at school on time each day. -Only picking up your child early if absolutely necessary. We also ask that if you do need to pick them up that it is done just before break times where possible, ( $10: 50 \mathrm{am} / 1: 50 \mathrm{pm}$ ) or at the end of recess (11:40am) or lunchtime ( $2: 40 \mathrm{pm}$ ). This also assists our office staff as locating students from the playground can be time consuming.
At St. Ambrose school we want the best for our students and their learning and we know that in working together we shine. We certainly finished the week shining brightly throughout our Olympic Events today. Thank you Mrs. Cavric, our staff and you our families for making this day

## Naidoc Week

Last week our school celebrated NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee and this year was all about celebrating Indigenous culture and identity. The 2024 theme is Keep the fire burning! Blak, loud and proud. The theme honours the enduring strength and vitality of First Nations culture - with fire a symbol of connection to Country, to each other, and to the rich tapestry of traditions that define Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Our students continue to learn about our first nations people and how we can respect and learn from them.

## Swimming Information Sessions

All of our students participate in a swimming information session prior to starting their swimming lessons. The lessons not only focus on swimming skills but also on water safety including what to do if someone needs help in the water and what marine life not to touch.


Parent-Student-teacher Conversations

Thank you for making the time to meet with your teachers this week or next week. it was great to see so many of you.

To continue our work on our school improvement goals, this year we offered students from years three to six to attend these meetings. Three-way conferences involve conversations between the student, their parents, and their teacher. They allow our students to share with parents and teachers their growth as a learner as well as goals for future learning.

Through this process children can take more responsibility for their progress and achievement, exercise their voice and agency and demonstrate a growing understanding of their development as independent learners.
In three-way conferencing, all three parties - the student, parents, and the teacher - sit together and talk about the student's learning, with the student taking an equal role. Students will be provided with a scaffold for this process. If you would prefer to meet without your child please notify your child's teacher via email.

Year prep, one and two pupils parents continued to meet just with the teacher 1-1.

## Roof Laws

Following the recent tragic accident at a school in Melbourne where a teacher fell from a roof MACS are reviewing their policies and wish the following to be shared with you:
"As stated previously, the safety, health and wellbeing of our students and staff is the most important priority for MACS, and therefore, following the tragic circumstances that took place last term, a careful and thorough review has commenced into the circumstances surrounding the incident to identify what we can do to ensure that a tragedy such as this never happens again. This includes
reviewing our existing policies, procedures and requirements relating to roof access.
While the review is underway, I require that you direct your staff - including permanent, fixed term, casual and CRT staff and parent volunteers - that until further notice they must not undertake any activities that would involve them working on roofs, or any similar locations where there is a risk of falling. I also remind you that any contractors working for us on roofs or otherwise at heights above two metres must have the appropriate training and qualifications, risk assessments and equipment to control their risks."

I ask that you are not tempted to climb up on our roof on the weekend to retirieve balls that your children may say are up there. Your safety is more important.

## Naplan 2024

Last week our Year 3 and 5 students brought home their NAPLAN results. As you are aware, NAPLAN is a national assessment to see how your child's skills and understanding in literacy and numeracy compare against national standards. We encourage parents to take the time to look over these reports. The front page explains the achievement scale, the middle two pages show your child's results and the back page explains the achievement standard. It is important that parents keep this NAPLAN report in a safe place as the school does not get copies of individual students reports. When enrolling into secondary school, schools will ask for a copy of this report that only parents can provide. Naplan tests are one of many ways we assess our students.

Gospel Reflection: Mk 6:30-34

Earlier in this chapter in Mark, the disciples had received their Great Commission- baptizing, teaching, healing and casting out demons. News had spread so far and wide that even their time to eat a meal was limited. Certainly, the
disciples were doing the work Jesus had sent them to do, but this was not the only thing that they needed to learn. We see that Jesus' heart is not just moved "with pity" for the crowds but with compassion for those who sought to follow, serve, and build the Kingdom of God. For in order to continue spreading the Gospel, they also would need to recognize the necessity of physical and spiritual rest.
This lesson, however, would have to wait until another day as Jesus chose to minister to those who had followed them to their place of rest. Only He knew the disciples'exhaustion and the need to gather strength and resolve. And only He truly understood the longing and hunger in the hearts of those awaiting the Good News. Therein lies the struggle and the joy in our lives as disciples.

Dear Parents/Carers/Guardians of Year 5 students
The partnership between Parish Primary Schools and local Catholic secondary schools such as Sacred

I am writing today as you make the fundamentally important decision of which secondary school is right for your daughter or son. I am aware that there are local independent schools that are asking for early enrolment commitments to guarantee places at Year 7. Given that, it is important to note that the criteria for enrolment at Sacred Heart College (and all Catholic secondary schools in the Melbourne Archdiocese) gives priority to students who are enrolled in a Parish Primary School.
Students who have received the sacraments have a higher priority, but we expect all students who submit an enrolment application by the closing date (Friday 26 July) and are enrolled at a Parish Primary School will be offered an enrolment place for Year 7 2026.
